

Our Speaker



Dr. Russell Jeung is a Professor and the Chair of the Asian American Studies Department at San Francisco State University. He co-created the Stop AAPI Hate reporting center with leaders from the Asian Pacific Policy and Planning Council (A3PCON) and Chinese for Affirmative Action (CAA). Stop AAPI Hate tracks cases of discrimination against Asian Americans across the nation. The group recognizes that in order to effectively address anti-Asian racism, we must work to end all forms of structural racism leveled at Black, Indigenous, and other communities of color.

Our Speaker



Vincent Pan is the Co-Executive Director of the civil rights group Chinese for Affirmative Action (CAA), where he advocates for immigrant rights, economic justice, and educational equity. In addition to his role at CAA, Vincent has been a leader on social and racial justice issues—this includes expanding HIV/AIDS treatment in China with The Clinton Foundation and serving as the Board Co-Chair of the Center for Asian American Media (CAAM). Vincent is also a former member of the San Francisco Police Commission.

Our Speaker



Lateefah Simon is a 20-year veteran organizer for racial justice in Oakland and the Bay Area. She has been the President of the Akonadi Foundation since 2016. That same year—driven by the death of Oscar Grant—she ran and was elected to the Bay Area Rapid Transit Board of Directors of which she now serves as President. Lateefah is also a member of California State University's Board of Trustees and is frequently turned to by state officials for strategic advice on policy matters related to racial justice. Lateefah received the MacArthur Foundation "Genius" Award in 2003—making her the youngest woman ever to receive the award at that time.

Our Speaker



Carl Chan is the Director of Claremont Development, a San Francisco East Bay real estate company. He also serves on the Board of Directors of Asian Health Services, providing health, social, and advocacy services for all in need. He is often referred to as the “Mayor” of Oakland Chinatown due to his leadership and support in the revitalization and public safety advocacy efforts through organizations like the Oakland Chinatown Chamber of Commerce and the Neighborhood Crime Prevention Council. Carl is also the Chair of the Greater Oakland Chapter (GOC) of Asian Pacific Islander American Public Affairs (APAPA) and a member of the Asian Real Estate Association of America (AREAA).
